Working at The College of St. Scholastica (2014 – present) has afforded me the opportunity to serve in professional and institutional leadership capacities on the Sustainable Business Model Group, Native American Taskforce, and Inclusive Excellence Committee. In each appointment, we are engaged in establishing goals and criteria, administering and managing funds (\$100K), providing recommendations, and informing decisions for integration into the College's strategic work to envision an inclusive and economically sustainable future. From 2014 - 2015, I served on the Fund of the Sacred Circle through the Headwaters Foundation. The fund provides \$5,000 - \$10,000 operating grants to American Indian organizations in Minnesota and Wisconsin to address systemic injustices affecting their communities. My role included reviewing proposals, conducting and leading site visits, and making funding decisions. As an Imagine Duluth 2035 Vision Committee member (2016 – 2018), I developed my leadership capacity serving on an advisory body - and as an ambassador for the city – ensuring the plan included input from all voices from across the city. I gained valuable insight and experience actively engaging in focus groups, forums, community listening sessions, and planning sessions. The Imagine Duluth work provided knowledge and experience with the interconnected factors of the Community Development Committee's focus areas: housing, public facilities, public services, homeless services, and economic development. Finally, I am recent graduate of the Master of Business Administration Change and Leadership program (December 2017) at The College of St. Scholastica. The program equipped me with change and leadership skills such as decision-making, active listening, and mission focused energy that will add value and positively benefit the work of the Community Development Committee.
