## Why are you interested in serving on a board or commission?

In 2002 we relocated from Chicago, IL for my wife's professional career opportunity to lead St. Luke's Foundation as the executive director. We had Duluth on our radar since the late 90's as a place we would like to raise our family. Major motivators attracting us to the Twin Port area included Minnesota's public school offering K-12 as well as the community and 4-year university experience; cultural and arts organizations; the potential economic growth of the region; and the natural beauty that avails us living on the largest Great Lake. The kids were ages one and three when we arrived and with my diverse professional background I began to cultivate and build relationships in the community. It is through this network of valuable connections in my Church, my work with veterans, my professional career in pharmaceutical sales and today in higher education student support services, as well as community participation in civic organizations like Rotary that my desire to serve on the Duluth Human Rights Commission has developed. My desire to serve on the Commission was recently affirmed by an invitation to submit my application for a board position. This came on the heels of returning from a powerful, historical 98-hour bus journey with a group of 35 community members to the National Memorial for Peace and Justice dedication in Montgomery, AL. This trip changed lives, including mine. The waves created by bringing light to this horrific part of American history continues to be felt and calls me to want to be an active part of effecting positive change for racial justice in the Twin Ports community. So much has been done here, as Duluth was a pioneer in being the first city to erect a memorial across the street from the sight where Elias Clayton, Elmer Jackson, and Isaac McGhie were lynched on June 15, 1920. But as we know from the national climate trickling down to our city streets (2016 A Vision and Agenda for Racial Equity in our Duluth, Voices for Racial Justice report), there are disparities in education, housing, employment, health and safety as well as severe political and cultural underrepresentation that keep groups of people from having equal access to opportunities to better themselves – our work is not done. I believe serving on the Commission would afford the opportunity to use my skills and passion to help achieve racial justice strategies that makes Duluth a community where all belong and thrive.
