Attached are signatures from a petition effort launched in Duluth, Minnesota in May 2016. The effort was not coordinated by any environmental group or organization. Rather, signatures were collected by small business owners here in the city.

The petition, which I brought to the attention of Blaise Sheridan in your D.C. office several months ago, is self-explanatory. I have also spoken with Mr. Sheridan over the phone regarding a related report that was mailed to your D.C. and St. Paul offices earlier.

Please note that the enclosed petition does not ask you to "take sides" on the issue at hand. Rather, it simply asks you to ensure that two of the U.S. Senate committees on which you sit that have jurisdiction in this matter (the Senate Energy Subcommittee on Forests, Public Lands & Mining and the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs) hold objective hearings on an issue that matters dearly to many of your constituents – not just those who live on the Range.

All we are asking for is a fair shake.

Public meetings conducted by state and federal agencies (the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and U.S. Forest Service) are no substitute for *Congressional oversight hearings* that, by their very nature, are designed to bring greater perspective and a broader level of transparency to the process.

Again, all that we as your constituents are asking for is a fair shake.

Those who signed the petition and the business owners who collected the signatures are anxious to see what you are going to do, and I will be following up with them. Please let me know of your plans as soon as possible.

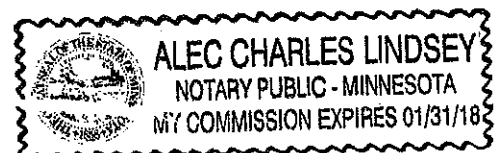

Hello Senator Klobuchar,

Attached are signatures from a petition effort launched in Duluth, Minnesota in May 2016. The effort was not coordinated by any environmental group or organization. Rather, signatures were collected by small business owners here in the city.

The petition is self-explanatory. I also hand-delivered a related report to your Minneapolis office several months ago and had the opportunity to speak briefly with one of your assistants.

You will notice that the stack of papers contains two versions of the petition: One is addressed to both you and Senator Al Franken, and the other to Senator Franken alone. The latter was developed and circulated first, prior to the author's knowledge that you, too, sit on an important U.S. Senate committee with jurisdiction in this matter. Since the signers of the original petition were indeed seeking Congressional oversight hearings on the issue at hand, I am forwarding to you the complete compliment of petitions. As one business owner said to me, she was "100% comfortable" that those who signed the original petition at her establishment would have also signed the dual senator version.

Please note that the petition does not ask you to "take sides" on the issue at hand. Rather, it simply asks you to ensure that the U.S. Senate committee on which you sit that has oversight authority in this matter (the Senate Agriculture Subcommittee on Conservation, Forestry & Natural Resources) holds objective hearings on an issue that matters dearly to many of your constituents – not just those who live on the Range. 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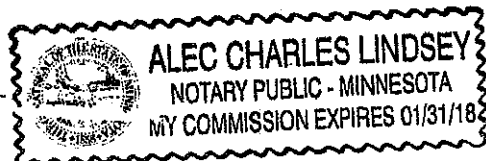

Ask Senators Al Franken and Amy Klobuchar to Hold Hearings ... NOW.

Senator Al Franken sits on: (1) the U.S. Senate Committee on Energy & Natural Resources **AND** its Subcommittee on **Forests, Public Lands & Mining** that oversees the U.S. Forest Service and the privatization of federal (public) assets; and (2) the **U.S. Senate Committee on Indian Affairs**.

Senator Amy Klobuchar sits on the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition & Forestry **AND** its Subcommittee on **Conservation, Forestry & Natural Resources** that directly oversees U.S. Forest Service actions involving land exchanges.

The U.S. Forest Service stated in November 2015 that it intends to transfer 6,650 acres of water-rich lands in the **Superior National Forest** to PolyMet Mining Corporation (Toronto, Canada), in exchange for other lands, so that the company can construct a new copper-nickel-cobalt-platinum-palladium-gold sulfide mine. **The final decision is expected in June 2016 and will be subject to 30-day congressional oversight requirements.**

According to computer modeling supplied by PolyMet and others, contaminated water from the PolyMet mine will travel both south (to the **St. Louis River/Lake Superior watershed**) and north (to the **Rainy River/Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness watershed**).

The state and federal agencies that prepared the mine's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) stated *repeatedly* therein: "Water quality modeling performed in support of this Final EIS indicates that water treatment systems would be needed **indefinitely** at the Mine Site and Plant Site."¹ There is some disagreement over exactly how long this will be, but in 2013 the agencies *repeatedly* stated, as documented in Appendix C of the Final EIS: "Modeling predicts that treatment activities will be a **minimum 200 years** at the Mine Site and a **minimum of 500 years** at the Plant site."²

The ore body that PolyMet intends to mine is on water-rich **public land** in the **Superior National Forest**, not private land. Equally important, the land is within the 1854 ceded territory where the Lake Superior Ojibwe retain treaty rights. For these reasons, members of the public, **both Native and non-Native**, are entitled to have a say on what happens.

Senators Franken and Klobuchar, due to their respective Senate Committee appointments, are in a unique position to make this happen.

Senator Franken, in your capacity as a member of the Senate Energy Subcommittee on Forests, Public Lands & Mining and the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs; and **Senator Klobuchar**, in your capacity as a member of the Senate Agriculture Subcommittee on Conservation, Forestry & Natural Resources, please ensure that your respective committees **hold oversight hearings** on any U.S. Forest Service decision to transfer 6,650 acres of water-rich lands in the Superior National Forest to PolyMet. Thank you!

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






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The state and federal agencies that prepared the mine's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) stated *repeatedly* therein: "Water quality modeling performed in support of this Final EIS indicates that water treatment systems would be needed *indefinitely* at the Mine Site and Plant Site."¹ There is some disagreement over exactly how long this will be, but in 2013 the agencies *repeatedly* stated, as documented in Appendix C of the Final EIS: "Modeling predicts that treatment activities will be a **minimum 200 years** at the Mine Site and a **minimum of 500 years** at the Plant site."²

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Senators Franken and Klobuchar, due to their respective Senate Committee appointments, are in a unique position to make this happen.

Senator Franken, in your capacity as a member of the Senate Energy Subcommittee on Forests, Public Lands & Mining and the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs; and **Senator Klobuchar**, in your capacity as a member of the Senate Agriculture Subcommittee on Conservation, Forestry & Natural Resources, please ensure that your respective committees **hold oversight hearings** on any U.S. Forest Service decision to transfer 6,650 acres of water-rich lands in the Superior National Forest to PolyMet.
