The SAKI Site Coordinator's Program to Aid Victims of Sexual Assault job description is listed as an attachment in "Job Descriptions."

The SAKI Victim Advocate will work directly with victims of sexual violence who are being contacted due to previously unsubmitted sexual assault kits. She will work directly with law enforcement including investigators to ensure victim-centered procedures are being utilized when victims are notified regarding previously unsubmitted SAKs. She will provide ongoing support advocacy as needed to victims/survivors who are contacted through the SAKI project.
