Ski trails with state-of-the-art snowmaking and lighting will provide a dependable season-long venue for recreational skiing, youth activities, and regional high school events, including hosting Statewide Nordic finals. The project has become a regional center of activity for cross country skiing by extending the season and enabling skiing when there is inadequate natural snow. All Section 7 High School Nordic ski teams are scheduled to train or compete at the Nordic Center: Ely, Grand Rapids, Cloquet/Esko/Carlton, Two Harbors/Cook County, Hibbing, Marshall, Mesabi East, North Star Academy, Denfeld, Duluth East, Moose Lake, and Mora. The trail provides the first ski trails for the underserved western Duluth neighborhoods below Grand Ave with ADA accessible access and wide trails providing service to all abilities.

# 6) EQUIPMENT PURCHASE DESCRIPTION:

Purchase supports build-out of the water pumping/snowmaking facilities for the Nordic Center at Spirit Mountain Recreation Area. The Nordic Center is 2.5km of trail, with snowmaking on 1.5 (0.9 mi) km with the remaining 1.0 km (0.6 mi) of trails relying on natural snow. The center

receives daily grooming and is being heavily used. Additional pump capacity combined with additional snow guns will decrease the time needed to adequately coat the 1.5 km (0.9 mi) snowmaking loop from nearly four weeks to two weeks ensuring early season snow and will also provide snow on an additional 300 meter (0.2 mi) loop for a total of 1.8 km (1.1 mi). Guns are portable to access hydrants at various locations. Hoses are used to extend the reach of the existing hydrants to the additional loops.

Equipment includes one additional primary pump and one snowmaking gun: <a href="Pump: Plowserve">Pump: Plowserve</a> (IDP) Model 10EMM 7 stage Vertical Turbine Can Pump powered by a GE Motor Model NOCAT446V. Pump is rated at 1000gpm @ 1215' TDH + 125' suction = 1,340' (580psi) discharge. Motor is rated at 3550 RPM, 460/3/60. 1.15 service factor. Continuous duty. 40C Ambient. WP-1 enclosure. See Attachment C for specification sheet, vendor estimate and Appendix E for Made in America certification.

<u>Snowgun</u>: Standard PoleCat: 3-wheel galvanized turntable chassis with extendable jacks for frame leveling, snow groomer lifting brackets, 10 HP fan, lOHP Hydrovane compressor, 18 nozzle stainless steel heated spray manifold with heated water side center nucleator, heated check valve, 3- valve stainless steel valve manifold with heated 3-way self-draining ball valves, 30 mesh water filter and cam and groove fitting on water inlet, oscillation, halogen flood light, strobe light, manual controls, 100' cord and Hubbell black pin and sleeve plug. 






There are 22.1 km (13.7 mi) of cross-country trails that are groomed at the top of Spirit Mountain with no GIA assistance. The Nordic Center is 2.5km of trail, with snowmaking on 1.5km and does not receive any GIA assistance.

# 10) EVIDENCE OF APPLICANT CAPABILITY:

The Property and Facilities Management Division of the Department of Public Administration is responsible for the management of all City of Duluth properties, facilities and equipment. The City of Duluth has 148 buildings (comprising 1,200,00 square feet), over a hundred park properties, a diverse array of other real estate holdings, and \$10,572,000 in equipment assets. The Division is made up of three distinct offices: Property Services, Maintenance and Operations, and Project Management. Maintenance and Operations is responsible for the day to day and long-term maintenance, repair, and physical operation of City facilities. This work group is comprised of custodial staff, building maintenance staff, and construction tradesmen (plumbers, electricians, and carpenters) and their vehicles and equipment.

The equipment will be utilized and stored at Spirit Mountain Recreation Area, a quasi-governmental facility and subsidiary of the City of Duluth. Spirit Mountain operates and maintains ski lifts, two lodge buildings, a maintenance building, snow guns for downhill skiing and the Nordic Center and grooming equipment for downhill and cross country skiing as well as several other facilities and attractions.

## 11) PUBLIC NEED FOR AND BENEFIT OF PURCHASE:

Why should this project be funded? What safety concerns will be addressed with this project? Is there urgency to move ahead with this project now, and what consequences are looming? #### Rationale

Snowmaking provides early and season long dependable snow for cross country skiing for all users the first time in the Duluth area. The closest trail with snowmaking is Mt. Itasca in Coleraine which is 80 miles away. The Twin Cities area has two parks with snowmaking approximately 160 miles to the south. Ski trails with snowmaking provide a dependable season-long venue for recreational skiing, youth activities and regional high school events, including hosting Statewide Nordic finals.

The Nordic Center's Phase I system opened to high school practices in 2018 with six teams practicing on the 500-meter loop (0.3 mile). By January 2, the full 1.5 km (0.9 mi) snowmaking loop was open. all Section 7 High School Nordic ski teams training or competing at the Nordic Center: Ely, Grand Rapids, Cloquet/Esko/ Carlton, Two Harbors/Cook County, Hibbing, Marshall, Mesabi East, North Star Academy, Denfeld, Duluth East, Moose Lake, and Mora. Other events include DXC women's ski and DXC's Wednesday night race series, Learn to Ski, and Advanced Training. The project has become a regional center of activity for cross country skiing by extending the season early and late and providing skiing when there is inadequate natural snow.

As the snow pack within the city starts to melt, Spirit Mountain will continue with grooming and snow farming and expects Nordic Center use well into April.

Snowmaking on these wide, smooth trails accommodates users of many skill levels. The closest loop to the trail head will be a "green" (most easy) level beginner trail. The subsequent loops progress in difficulty the further you get away from the trail head. Further, the adjacent neighborhoods at the bottom of Spirit Mountain along Grand Ave lack access to nordic ski trails. Neighborhoods in West Duluth have few trail options in general and no ski

trails in particular. Ski trails on the top of Spirit Mountain and at nearby Magney-Snively represent some of the best cross country skiing available. They are only 2 miles away but require a drive that is 15 to 20 minutes around the base of the mountain to the top where parking is extremely limited. This presents a significant barrier for many low-income families that lack transportation as well as to young people and informs the need for system revisions to better serve the public with guaranteed snow.



# Safety




Figure 1: Nordic Trail Cross Section.

The design of the Nordic Center will follow guidelines for cross country ski trail development in practice through the International Ski Federation (FIS) and the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) homologation guidelines. Even though these organizations are primarily concerned with international level competitions, the principles they apply focus on safety and "skiability" or "flow" of ski courses which translate to a safe and enjoyable ski experience. Standard trail width is 30 feet on the up-hills and 24' on the downhills, which will allow for two skate skiers to pass as well as provide room for a single classical track (See Figure 1).

When the trails become crowded with skiers of differing abilities, skiers need to be able to pass. One skater in the center of the trail can block it at narrower width. This width trail makes for a less intimidating experience for less skilled skiers. Higher level competitive events approved by the US Ski Association (USSA) and International Ski Federation (FIS) require a 9 meter (30 foot) minimum width on uphill trails.

The entire system is designed as one-way and will provide ski terrain for all levels of skier ability. The design will incorporate a core trail with cut-offs and additional higher difficulty loops so a variety of configurations can be explored depending on distance and difficulty interests. Central Duluth and East Duluth nordic trails in Hartley, Chester, Bagley, and Piedmont

ski areas have no more than 3-4 km (2-2.5 mi) loops with natural snow that are heavily used by neighborhood skiers, a key target population for this project.

# Urgency

The Nordic Ski Center, especially its ADA accessible parking, existing Grand Avenue Chalet and location in an underserved neighborhood, provides long awaited access to the sport. The west Duluth area, City of Duluth, and DXC are significantly invested in the project as the lack of snow becomes more frequently occurring throughout the season and creates a hardship for snow-based businesses and area school ski teams. A venue with snowmaking brings significant fiscal impact to the economically distressed west Duluth area.

The time necessary to fully snow the trails to competition will be two weeks with the new equipment.

#### Annual user numbers

Utilization has exceeded expectations for the first year of operation. As noted in the #11: Rationale above, participation to date for Winter 2018/19 was well over 3,000 without a tally of the number of visits from those holding season passes. 2018/19 was a good snow year, though late in starting. If climate conditions continue to present poor snow coverage, Spirit Mountain expects that the Nordic Center will see numbers well over those seen last year.

#### 12) CONTEXT OF PURCHASE IN A WIDER PLAN:

Demonstrate compatibility with local/area/state trail plans, and compatibility with plans guiding management of trail systems, etc. What relationship does the proposed purchase have to other outdoor recreation facilities and trails? Use the box below.

Over the past eight years, the City of Duluth completed recreation planning initiatives for the St. Louis River Corridor that include and overlap the Spirit Mountain Recreation Area. A major thrust of this effort was to develop a Trails Master Plan for Western Duluth to document the existing trail network (walking, hiking, cycling, Nordic ski, multi-use, snowmobile, equestrian), consider the needs of the various user groups and create a long term development plan to make Duluth the premier trail city in North America.

Extensive public input contributed to mini-master plans, master plans, or plan updates for significant components located in, travel through, or connect to Spirit Mountain. Those include the Duluth Traverse Mountain Bike Trail system, the Cross Country Ski Trail system, the Grand Ave Nordic Center, and the Cross City Trail.

Yes, use will increase. The user response to the trails since they opened has been overwhelmingly enthusiastic. Additional guns and pumps will open up additional loops to snowmaking, snow in the existing 1.5 km snowmaking loop faster, guarantee a high quality ski experience for local users, and ensure local and regional ski tournaments can happen. Conflicts and overcrowding are unlikely as the Nordic Center Mini Master Plan included expansion to the full 3.3 km (2 miles) and public and resident concerns have been addressed.


