The posted signs at these locations said AT&T was the applicant, but the stated application in the paperwork is Smartlink, LLC. Next, there would be three of these all within a tiny area by the Lester Park neighborhood and there is no stated reason why this is necessary. Finally, the Oneida Stress location is directly across from an elementary school and this is not listed in the paperwork as far as I could tell. Duluth children deserve better! High powered cell towers should not be located right next to where children are trying to learn and play. I will be following up about this if these are passed.
