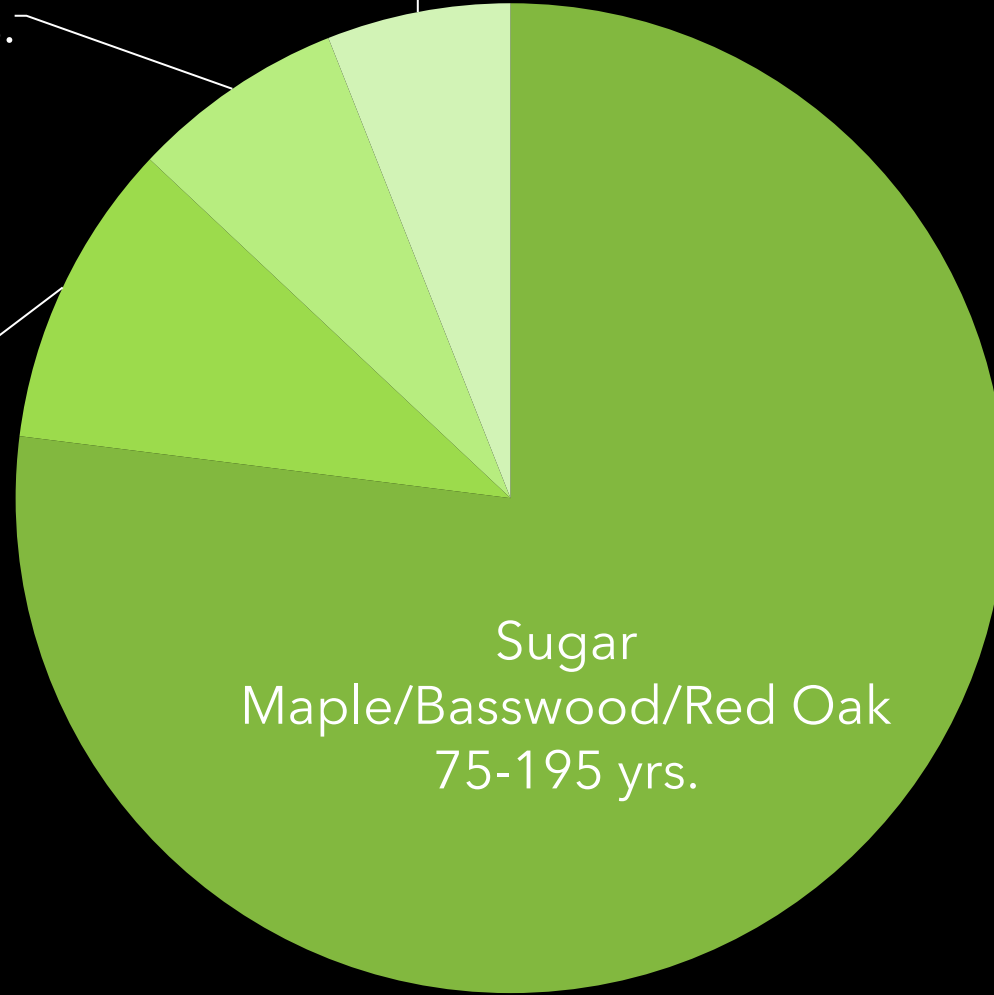

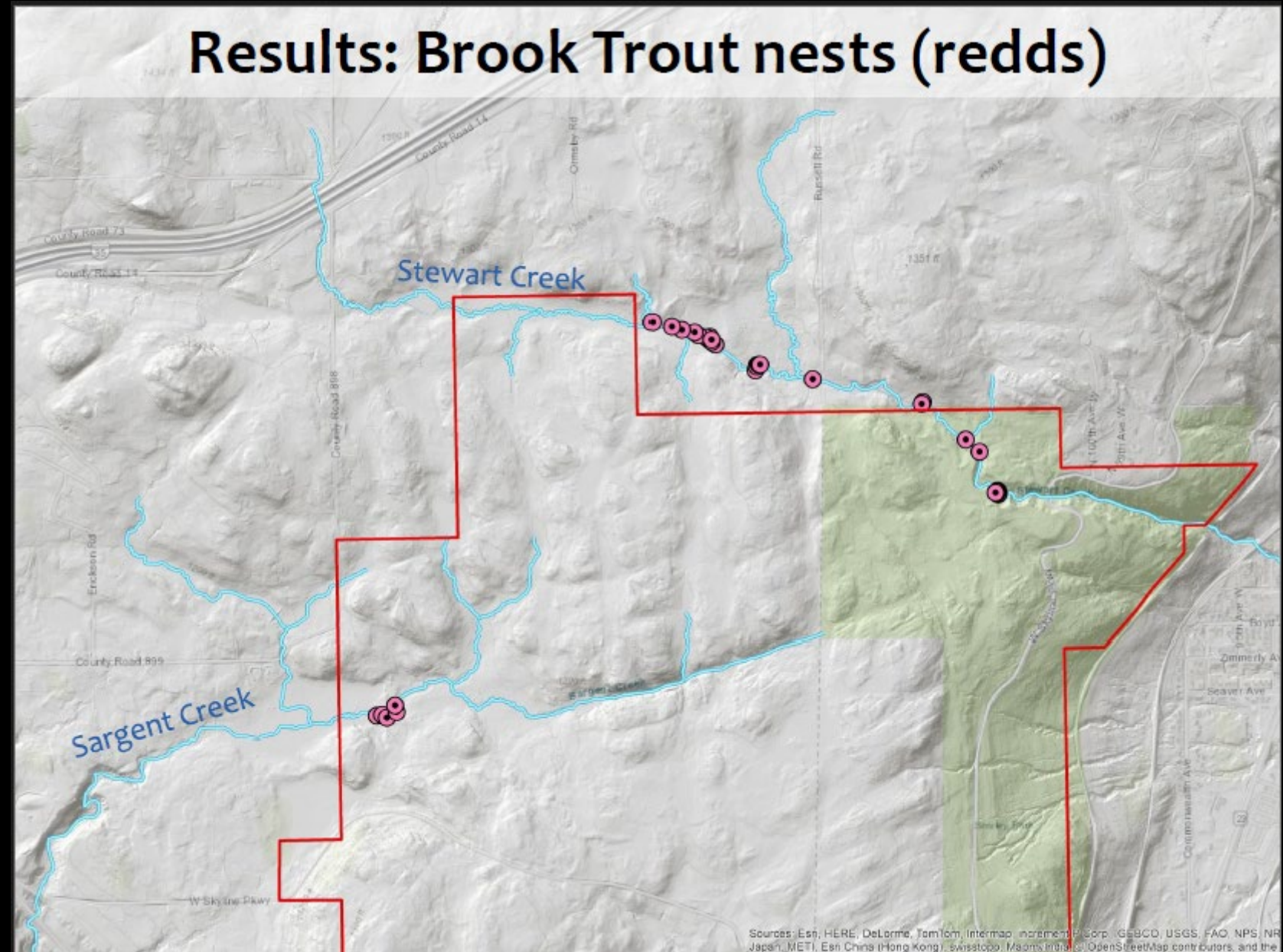

Mid-Continent Rift System

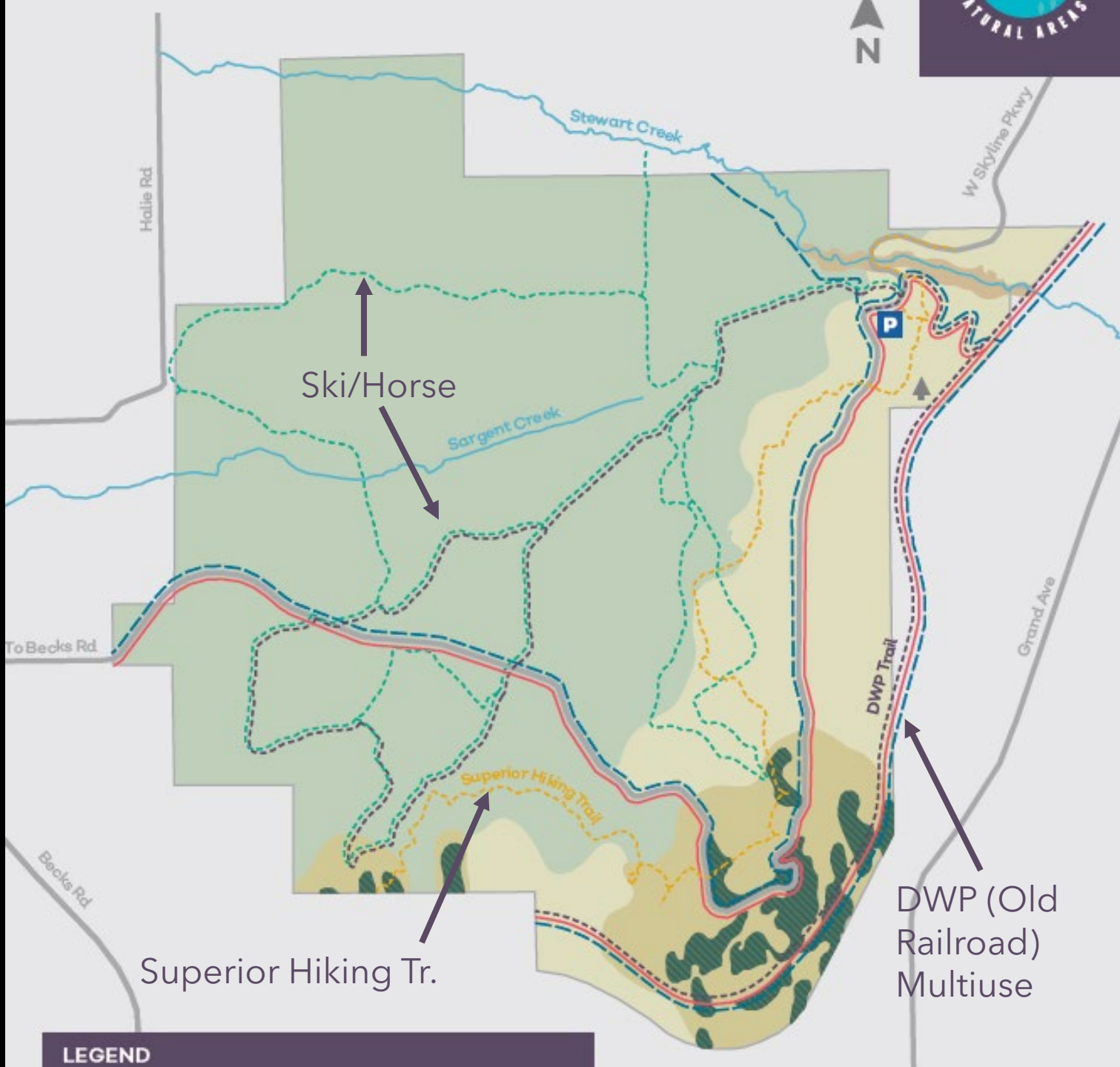

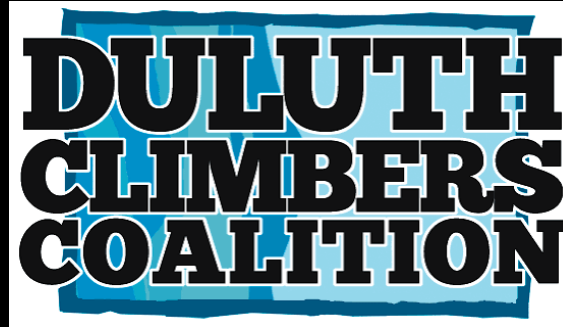
